"This technology has the potential to give people with Type 1 diabetes and their caregivers more freedom from constant worry, daily insulin injections, and an improved quality of life that has been out of reach until now," said Laura Cameron, senior director, Diabetes Group and Consumer Care. "Bringing the new pump to Canadians, along with a series of other technologies for chronic pain, neurosurgery, and ear, nose, and throat procedures, is a fitting way for Medtronic to put an exclamation mark on 50 years of innovation and commitment to patient care in Canada."
